Answers to Barbee Trivia

- 1. Isaiah and Catherine Brantley Barbee lived in Chatham County
- 2. According to family tradition, Isaiah Barbee was killed in a robbery in 1830, shortly before the birth of his son Isaiah Grayson Barbee. His mother Catherine Brantley Barbee remarried.
- 3. Young Isaiah Grayson Barbee was raised by his aunt and uncle, Mahala Brantley and William Minter Burns (Mahala was Catherine's sister).
- 4. Isaiah Grayson Barbee married Martha Jane Burke on November I5, I854, and they lived in Chatham County, NC.
- 5. Isaiah Grayson Barbee served in Company E, 63rd N. C. Calvary Regiment of the Southern Confederate Army throughout the Civil War. He traveled through Onslow County during the war and decided that was where he would like to live. He and his wife moved their family to Onslow County in the fall of 1865 settling northwest of Richlands.
